HIGH SCHOOL Game Rules:

NCAA RULES AND REGULATIONS

DIFFERENCES BETWEEN NCAA AND FEDERATION

- Flag down; ball becomes loose in offensive box, no whistle until ball leaves box or defense gains possession.
- Prior to whistle illegal procedure face-off man must immediately leave field
 - Play will resume immediately.
- Change of Possession Offsides- Ball is re-started at location when whistle was blown
- Time outs- can only be called in offensive zone or during a dead ball.
- All counts in effect: clearing and into offensive zone.

MODIFICATIONS FOR TOURNAMENT

- 26 minute running time halves. Last 2 minutes of game is stop time.
- All penalties stop time
- 4 minute half time
- 1 45 second timeout per game per team, clock does stop.
- Timeout can be called during dead ball or in possession in offensive zone:
 - Offensive zone is sideline to sideline below restraining line.
- Overtime: Non-playoff: 4 minute sudden-death overtime. If still tied, remains a tie.
- Playoff- 4 minute overtime followed by 2:00 Braveheart if necessary.
- If still tied, repeat Braveheart with different players until winner.
- No Horns, except post flag downs only.

7th and 8th Grade(All 8, All 7 or Mix of 7/8) Game Rules:

SAME AS HIGH SCHOOL RULES

22 minute running time halves.

5th and 6th Grade(All 6th, All 5th or Mix of 5/6) Game Rules:

SAME AS 7th and 8th Grade Rules

Exception: Will not have any counts.

Applicable to all games:

Leading team keep it in last two minutes.

Time (penalty, game, half) will be kept at the bench.

Bench timer will give 2 minute warning: prior to start of game, end of first half, end of game.

No free clears, ever.

Field timer must be made aware of any game disputes immediately following the game. Field timer will report disputes to Admin Tent.

Differences between age groups:

Only High School requires pre-whistle technical foul for faceoff player to leave field.

Only 5th and 6th does not have counts.

Faceoff Rule Clarification:

If any member of a team commits a pre-whistle illegal procedure foul, the faceoff player must leave the field immediately; not necessarily the person who committed the procedure foul. The officials do not wait until the faceoff player leaves the field, play resumes immediately.
